- 1. Applying and removing ace bandages, ted hose and binders, braces & splints.
- 2. Feeding techniques for residents with swallowing problems.
- **3.** Bowel or bladder training programs to regain continence.
- 4. Enemas, suppositories, break up & removal if fecal impaction, and vaginal douches.
- 5. Positioning and emptying of the urinary catheter bag & cleaning around the urinary catheter.
- 6. Chest physiotherapy or postural drainage.

7. Clean dressing changes excluding packing wounds & application of prescribed enzymatic debriding agents.

- 8. Collection and testing of finger stick blood samples.
- 9. Care of well-established colostomy or ileostomy.
- **10.** Care for pressure ulcers up to & including a Stage II pressure ulcer.
- **11.** Inhalation medication by machine.
- **12.** Forcing & restricting fluids.
- **13.** Maintaining accurate intake and output data.
- **14.** Medication administration through a well-established gastrostomy feeding tube.
- **15.** Medication administration through injections.
- 16. Oxygen administration and monitoring.

17. Care of residents who are physically restrained & the use of care practices as alternatives to restraints.

- **18.** Oral suctioning.
- **19.** Care of well-established tracheostomy.
- **20.** Administering & monitoring of tube feedings through a well-established gastrostomy tube.
- 21. Monitoring of continuous positive air pressure devices (CPAP and BIPAP)
- 22. Application of prescribed heat therapy.
- 23. Application and removal of prosthetic devices.
- **24.** Ambulation using assistive devices that requires physical assistance.
- 25. Range of motion exercises.
- 26. Any other prescribed physical or occupational therapy.
- **27.** Transferring semi-ambulatory or non-ambulatory residents.

28. Tasks performed by a nurse aide II according to the scope of practice as established in the Nursing Practice Act & rules under act in 21 NCAC 36.

*Understand that this list is not inclusive. There are other tasks that unlicensed personnel can perform with additional training, in conjunction with a facility's policies and procedures. These would include: use of insulin pumps, Hoyer lift or other mechanical lifts, emptying certain surgical drains, etc. All training must be documented.
